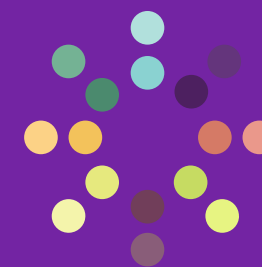

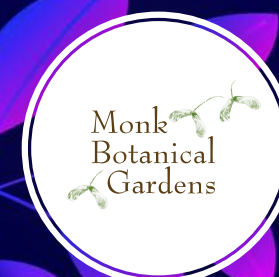

(Left) With a larger, paved, and well-lit parking lot, we'll host events that will accommodate more guests, spreading the magic of the Gardens far and wide.

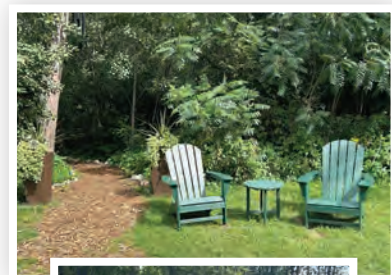


(Right) It's petal to the metal for the English Garden! Construction crews lay the foundation for what will be the backdrop of a beautiful water fountain.

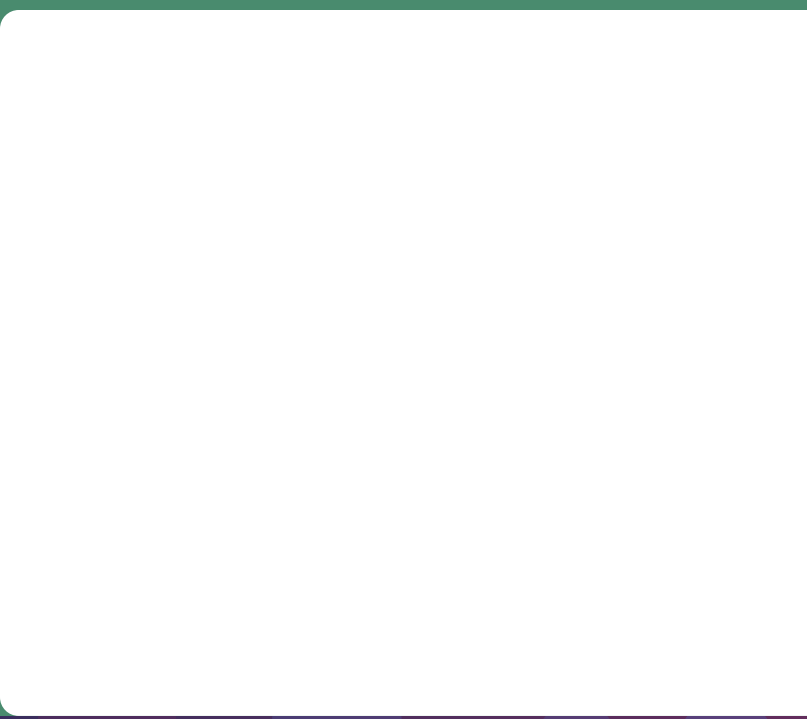
